Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Culture Programs

Ripples of Time: Freshwater and Saltwater Cultural Tours (History and Geography – stages 4–6)

This program takes students on a journey of saltwater and freshwater cultures from Tasmania to the Tiwi and Torres Strait Islands.

Alick Tipoti: A Retrospective of the Artist’s Career (Cross-Curricular – stages 4–6)

An educator-led tour of this Torres Strait Islander artist’s incredible catalogue.

Weaving Workshop: Traditional Textiles and Handicrafts (Cross-Curricular – stages 4–6)

A hands-on workshop that allows students to explore the range and sophistication of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander woven crafts.

Museum Educator-led Programs

Investigating Sustainability: Ocean Science and Health (Science – stage 4 & Sustainability)

Using cutting-edge technology to investigate and explore ocean science and how to create a sustainable future for the blue planet.

Sea Monsters (Science – stages 4 & 5)

Everyone ate someone! Investigate what fossils can teach us about the behaviour, habitat and reproduction of prehistoric ocean predators.

Metals in Maritime Environments (Chemistry – stage 5)

A practical workshop where students work on the principles of chemistry in maritime environments.

Cook and Encounters 2020

(History/Modern History – stages 4 & 5)

The museum is presenting a series of exhibitions and programs revising the 250th Anniversary of Cook’s landing on the Australian east coast from a variety of perspectives, including a view from the shore. Visit our website for more details.

Maritime Archaeology (History – stages 4 & 5)

A hands-on workshop and tour of related shipwreck material in the museum.

Maritime Archaeology (Ancient History – stage 6)

Students examine artefacts from shipwrecks, investigate archaeological techniques and interpret archaeological material.

Immigration (History – stage 5)

This program involves a workshop investigating various aspects of immigration, tours of galleries and a Vietnamese migrant boat.

Pyrmont Walk: Changing Places (Geography stage 5)

A case study highlighting the changing nature of the community of Pyrmont, factors that have given rise to these changes and the community’s response to some of these changes.

Senior Pyrmont Walk – Urban Dynamics Case Study (Geography stage 6)

The Senior Pyrmont Walk delivers a case study highlighting the urban dynamics of one of Australia’s most densely populated and storied suburbs.

Bathers, Bikinis and Beachwear (Technology, Textiles & Design – stage 5)

A hands-on workshop that explores the evolution of swimwear from historical, cultural and social perspectives

History of Swimwear (Technology, Textiles & Design – stage 6)

This hands-on program provides students with experience of changing textile technologies, design practices, and performance of textiles.

Human Rights Trail – Hidden Histories (History/English – stages 4 & 5)

This tour highlights hidden histories in our collection through a human rights lens.

ESL Highlights – Museum Treasures (English, Language & Literacy – stage 4)

This program embeds language and literacy skills into a museum highlights treasure trail.

Museum Highlights (Cross-curricular – stages 4–6)

This program introduces students to the concept of why we have museums and in particular, what a maritime museum is.

Underwater Drone Program (Cross-curricular – stages 4–6)

A world-first program allowing students the chance to get hands-on with sector-leading technology using our fleet of underwater ROVs.
