**ANDERSON Robert**, Inverness, 28, AB: gunner *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage  
**BOOTIE John**, midshipman, died dysentery 4.2.1771  
**CHARLTON John**, London, 15, captain's servant 1.5.1770: Cook's servant *Greville* 1765-8  
**CHILDS Joseph**, Dublin, 29, AB and Ship's cook from 1.2.1771  
**CLERKE Charles**, Essex, 25, master's mate and 3<sup>rd</sup> lieutenant 26.5.1771: 2<sup>nd</sup> ltn *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage, commander *Discovery* 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage, died before returning to England 1779  
**COLLETT William**, Buckinghamshire, 20, AB: AB *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage  
**COOK James**, Yorkshire, 40, 1<sup>st</sup> lieutenant  
**COX Matthew**, Dorset, 22, AB: punished stealing Maori potatoes Bay of Islands  
**DAWSON William**, Deptford, 19, AB: AB *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage  
**DOZEY John**, the Brazils, 20, AB, died at the Cape 7.4.1771  
**EVANS Samuel**, Quartermaster and boatswain 5.2.1771  
**FLOWER Peter**, Guernsey, 18, AB, drowned at Rio de Janeiro 2.12.1768: had served with Cook five years  
**FORWOOD Stephen**, gunner, ringleader stealing rum 2.12.1769  
**GATHREY John**, boatswain, died dysentery 4.2.1771  
**GOODJOHN John**, AB: in 1791 he petitioned Banks for help and Banks gave him a guinea  
**GORE John**, 3<sup>rd</sup> lieutenant and 2<sup>nd</sup> lieutenant on Hicks' death: went with Banks to Iceland 1772, 1<sup>st</sup> lieutenant *Resolution* 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage and after Clerke's death took command, Captain Greenwich Hospital  
**GRAY James**, Leith, 24, AB: and quartermaster 5.2.1771: boatswain *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage

**HAITE Francis**, Kent, 42, carpenter's crew, died 30.1.1771  
**HARDMAN Thomas**, London, 33, boatswain's mate and AB and sailmaker  
**HARVEY William**, London, 17, Hick's servant and AB and midshipman 7.2.1771 : midshipman *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage, master's mate *Resolution* 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage  
**HICKS Zachary**, Stepney, 29, 2<sup>nd</sup> lieutenant, died 26 May 1771 of consumption  
**HOWSON William**, London, 16, Captain's servant  
**HUGHES Richard**, London, 22, carpenter's mate and carpenter 15.8.1771  
**HUTCHINS Richard**, Deptford, 27, boatswain's mate and boatswain, punished 16.4.1769 for disobedience  
**JEFFS Henry**, ship's butcher, punished for assault on Tahitian woman, died 27.2.1771  
**JOHNSON Isaac**, Cheshire, 26, AB  
**JONES Samuel**, London, 22, AB: applied to Banks for help January 1786  
**JONES Thomas (1st)**, surgeon Monkhouse's servant: his widow petitioned Banks for help 1791  
**JONES Thomas (2nd)**, Wales, 27, AB  
**JORDAN Benjamin**, Deptford, 30, AB, died 31.1.1771  
**JORDAN Thomas**, boatswain's servant, deserted in the River Thames 12 September 1771  
**KNIGHT Thomas**, AB  
**LITTLEBOY Michael**, Deptford, 20, AB: petitioned Banks for help in obtaining a Customs House berth  
**LITTLEBOY Richard**, Deptford, 25, AB, punished stealing rum 2.12.1769  
**MAGRA James Maria**, New York, AB and midshipman 27.5.1771: author of a plan for colonising New South Wales, British consul at Teneriffe, secretary to British embassy at Constantinople, consul at Tangier

**MANLY Isaac George**, master's servant, midshipman *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage: 1837 Admiral of the Red  
**MATTHEWS Thomas**, servant to ship's cook  
**MOLYNEUX Robert**, Lancashire, 22, master, died 17.4.1771  
**MUNKHOUSE Jonathan**, midshipman, brother to surgeon, died 6.2.1771  
**MUNKHOUSE William Brougham**, surgeon, died Batavia of fever 5.11.1770  
**MOODY Samuel**, Worcester, 40, AB, carpenter's crew, died 30.1.1771  
**MOREY Nathaniel**, lieutenant Gore's servant  
**NICHOLSON James**, Scotland, 21, AB, punished theft Otaheiti, died 31.1.1771  
**NOWELL George**, AB, carpenter's crew and carpenter 12.2.1771  
**ORTON Richard**, captain's clerk, had his ears cut during a drunken joke  
**PARKER Isaac**, Ipswich, 27, AB and boatswain's mate 25.3.1769  
**PECKOVER William**, Northamptonshire, 21, AB: gunner *Discovery* 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage: after voyage requested recommendation for a job from Banks  
**PEREIRA Manoel**, entered at Rio 2.12.1768, AB, punished for stealing Maori potatoes, died 27.2.1771  
**PERRY William**, Chiswick, 21, surgeon's mate and surgeon on death of Monkhouse  
**PICKERSGILL Richard**, Yorkshire, 19, master's mate and master on Molyneux's death: 3<sup>rd</sup> Lieutenant *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage: slipped and drowned in River Thames July 1779  
**PONTO Antonio**, Venice, 24, AB  
**RAMSAY John**, Plymouth, 21, AB: ship's cook *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage and AB 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage, became a pensioner of the Chelsea Chest  
**RAVENHILL John Hull**, 49, sailmaker. Cook said he was old man about 70 or 80, and drunk every day, died 27.1.1771

**READING John**, Kinsale, 24, boatswain's mate, punished at Rio for not punishing others correctly, died at sea excess of rum 28.8.1769  
**REARDEN Timothy**, Ireland, 25, AB, died Batavia 24.12.1770  
**ROBERTS Daniel**, gunner's servant, died 2.2.1771  
**SATTERLEY John**, carpenter, died 12.1.1771: Cook said 'a Man much Esteem'd by me and every Gentleman on board'.  
**SAUNDERS Patrick**, midshipman, disrated AB 23.5.1770, deserted Batavia 25.12.1770  
**SIMMONDS Thomas**, Brentford Middlesex, 24, AB  
**SIMPSON Alexander**, AB, punished stealing rum 2.12.1769, died 21.1.1771  
**SMITH Isaac**, London, 16, AB, midshipman and master's mate. First to land at Botany Bay, assisted Cook in surveying: master's mate *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage. Became post-captain 1787, superannuated Rear Admiral 1807. Was Mrs Cook's cousin and lived with her for many years  
**STAINSBY Robert**, Darlington, 27, AB  
**STEPHENS Henry**, Falmouth, 28, AB, punished for refusing to eat fresh beef and for stealing potatoes in New Zealand  
**SUTHERLAND Forby**, Orkneys, 29, AB, died at Botany Bay 1.5.1770 of consumption  
**TAYLOR Robert**, armourer  
**TERRELL Edward**, Spitalfields, 19, carpenter's servant: AB *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage  
**THOMPSON John**, one handed ship's cook, died 31.1.1771  
**THURMAN John**, 20, AB impressed for New York sloop at Funchal 14.9.1768  
**TUNLEY James**, Blackwall London, 24, AB  
**WEIR Alexander**, Scotland, 35, quartermaster, drowned off Funchal 14.9.1768

**WILKINSON Francis**, Wales, AB, master's mate, died August 1771  
**WILLIAMS Charles**, Bristol, 38, AB  
**WOLFE Archibald**, Scotland, 38, AB, punished Otaheiti stealing nails, died 31.1.1771  
**WOODWORTH John**, AB, died Batavia 24.12.1770

## Marines

**BOWLES John**, private  
**DUNSTER Thomas**, private, punished refusing allowance of fresh beef 16.9.1768, died 25.1.1771  
**EDGCUMBE John**, sergeant: lieutenant of marine *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage  
**GIBSON Samuel**, private, deserted at Otaheiti 9.7.1769: corporal of Marines *Resolution* 2<sup>nd</sup> voyage, sergeant *Resolution* 3<sup>rd</sup> voyage  
**GREENSLAND William**, private, committed suicide overboard 26.3.1769  
**JUDGE William**, private, punished for abusive language to officer of the watch 30.11.1769  
**PAUL Henry**, private  
**PRESTON Daniel**, private, died 15.2.1771  
**ROSSITER Thomas**, drummer, punished for stealing rum 2.12.1769, and for drunkenness and assault 21.2.1771  
**TRUSLOVE John**, corporal, died 24.1.1771  
**WILSHIRE William**, private: wrote to Banks for help 23.8.1802 who gave him a guinea  
**WEBB Clement**, private, deserted Otaheiti 9.7.1769: wrote to Banks 1808 crippled by an accident and needed a pension

## Supernumeraries

**BANKS Joseph**, 24, botanist and Fellow of the Royal Society: Endeavour's voyage made him famous, became President of Royal Society 1778 to his death, adviser to George III and a great patron of the natural sciences, died 1820  
**BRISCOE Peter**, Banks' servant and assistant since his Oxford days  
**BUCHAN Alexander**, artist, died at Otaheiti, 17 April 1769 of epilepsy and was buried at sea  
**DALTON George**, Banks' black servant, died of hypothermia January 1769  
**GREEN Charles**, 33, astronomer, died from dysentery 29.1.1771  
**PARKINSON Sydney**, 23, artist, Scotland, died 26 January 1771 of dysentery, on voyage to the Cape  
**REYNOLD John**, Green's servant, died from dysentery 18.12.1770  
**RICHMOND Thomas**, Banks' black servant, died of hypothermia January 1769  
**ROBERTS James**, aged 16, Lincolnshire, Banks' servant and assistant  
**SOLANDER Daniel Carl**, 35, Sweden, naturalist: Banks' librarian 1771-1782, Keeper Natural History Department at British Museum 1773. Died 17 May 1782 of a massive cerebral haemorrhage, at Banks' house in Soho. Banks acted as his pallbearer.  
**SPORING Herman Deidrich**, Sweden, secretary and assistant, died 25 January 1771 of dysentery, on the voyage to the Cape  
**TARHETO**, Tupia's servant, died Batavia 17.12.1770  
**TUPIA**, Native of Otaheiti, died Batavia 20.12.1770  
**YOUNG Nick**, boy, taken on 18.4.69 in lieu of Buchan: with Banks to Iceland
